

Library of Birmingham integrated with REP Theatre, Birmingham

Development of New Public Library



The Project

The Library of Birmingham is a public library in Birmingham, situated on the west side of the city centre at Centenary Square, beside the Birmingham Rep Theatre to which it connects, and with which it shares some facilities.

The library, which is estimated to have cost £188.8 million, is viewed by the Birmingham City Council as a flagship project for the city's redevelopment. It has been described as the largest public library in the United Kingdom, the largest public cultural space in Europe, and the largest regional library in Europe.


